Canada-Manitoba Memorandum of Understanding respecting Lake Winnipeg and the Lake Winnipeg Basin (CA-MB MOU)

- MOU signed in September 2010 and extended to 2020
- Science Subsidiary Arrangement signed in 2012
- MOU Steering Committee
 - Consisting of relevant federal and provincial representatives
 - Co-chaired by ECCC and Manitoba Sustainable Development
 - Lake Winnipeg Adaptive Management Framework Subcommitee formed in 2018
 - Leads Lake Indicators and State of the Lake Reporting



Lake Winnipeg Basin Program (LWBP)

Budget 2017 - \$25.7M over 5 years to support Ministerial freshwater mandate commitments in Lake Winnipeg

Three program pillars:


- Nutrient Reduction
 - Science
 - Nutrient reduction action
- Collaborative Governance
 - Encourage and strengthen collaborative efforts throughout the basin
- Indigenous Engagement
 - Enhance opportunities, capacity and the engagement of Indigenous peoples





Nutrients - Science Activities

- ECCC Science Plan (\$8.5 M)
- Geomapping Projects
 - DFO substrate mapping in Lake Winnipeg (\$265 K)
 - NRCan/Province of Manitoba acquisition of LiDAR and updating the National Hydrometric Network (\$290 K)
- Directed Grants and Contribution Funding
 - Lake Winnipeg Research Consortium (\$950 K)
 - CanWIN Canadian Watershed Information Network (\$250 K)



Grants & Contribution Funding (\$9.2 M)

- Directed Projects (over 5 years) \$1.2 M
- Application-based Process \$8.0 M
 - Nutrient Reducing Actions
 - Collaborative Governance
 - Indigenous Engagement
- 2018/2019 Call for Proposals
 - 23 projects approved (\$3.8 M)
- 2019/2020 Call for Proposals
 - 44 Proposals received
- Future Proposal Calls
